Call to Order: President Kathy Harp called the March 20, 2020 special meeting to order at 2:00pm for a presentation from Dave Schwindt, from Schwindt & Company on Reserve Study Methodology and to discuss the CCC 2020 Reserve Study.

Architectural Control, Gary Newbore: Due to the Covid 19 pandemic, the CCC Architectural Committee has temporarily suspended the CC&R rules on Yard or Garden Art, section 7/10(i) through July 15, 2020 so residents who wish to install exterior Christmas lights may do so to promote unity, happiness, and comfort in these uncertain times.

Presentation of Reserve Study Methodology, Dave Schwindt: Due to the Covid 19 pandemic, Dave Schwindt, Schwindt & Company, called in to the meeting to review the two different types of reserve funding; the Cash Flow Method, and the Component Method. After explaining the different methods and their advantages and disadvantages, Dave answered questions from the board.

Presentation of CCC Reserve Study, John McLain and Jim Meierotto: In years past, CCC has used the Component Method to determine reserve amounts. Schwindt & Company completed a reserve study and suggest that CCC change to the Cash Flow Method. John McLain motioned that the CCC Board adopt the Schwindt & Company recommendations to replace the current method of calculating and managing reserves (i.e. spreadsheets) with the recommended "Cash Flow Method and Threshold Funding Model", as demonstrated in their most current January 21, 2020, Maintenance Plan and Reserve Study Report (originally performed in 2019 and updated in 2020). The Reserve Study has several components:

- a) A physical inventory of all CCC assets by an outside qualified consultant
- b) A financial 30-year forecast of asset replacements in future years values
- c) A calculation of annual assessments (dues) needed to achieve a "Threshold" minimum balance requirement defined by the CCC Board
- d) A maintenance plan for assets to assure accurate estimates for asset life

After board discussion the motion was seconded and passed unanimously.
